



Is Your Child Ready to Be Forward-Facing?

Route harness straps in *upper* slots at or above shoulder level.

Place car seat in upright position.

Keep harness straps snug.

Fasten harness clip at armpit level.



Forward-Facing Car Seat

Keep Kids Rear-Facing Longer: Even Kids Over 1 Year Old and Between 20 and 40 Pounds should remain rear-facing until they reach the height or weight limit of their car seat. Once reached, then the kids should be **Forward-Facing.**

Before You Hit the Road, Read This.

Take a minute to be sure your child is riding safely. Study your vehicle owner's manual and car seat instructions carefully.

- To install the car seat, use either the seat belt or use LATCH (lower anchors and tethers).
- The back seat is the safest place for kids of any age.
- **Send** in the car seat registration card to be notified if your car seat is recalled.
- **Never** use a car seat that has been involved in a crash.
- **Get** a tight fit--the seat should not move more than one inch from side to side or toward the front of the vehicle.
- **Check** your vehicle owner's manual to see if you need a locking clip. Not all seat belts will secure your car seat without it.
